Sample size: 800 telephone interviews, Landline + Cell Phone

Methodological Note

Landline sampling using Address-Based Sample with all residential addresses within the City of New Brunswick included in the initial draw. Addresses were matched to phone numbers drawn from public sources. This ABS Matched sample is supplemented with a RDD Landline Sample scrubbed for working numbers, drawn from residential exchanges that include New Brunswick. The RDD Landline sample is then also scrubbed against the ABS Matched sample, and against listed telephone directory leaving RDD generated numbers not included in any listing.

A second effort to reach cell phones will include beginning with the unmatched ABS sample, sending a postcard to add addresses, inviting the recipient to call into the call center.

Survey is fielded in both English and Spanish based on respondent preference.
